









Coed Bach Park, Pontarddulais, Swansea - A parkland site with recreational facilities and mature woodland. In 2012, the Friends of Coedbach Park funded by Environment Wales and the Pontarddulais Town Council commissioned an Ecology Survey. The aims were to identify the habitat and vegetation types occurring within the park for local knowledge and management. 47 different species of trees were identified including: oak, ash, birch, horse-chestnut, hazel, sycamore and alder, creating a woodland habitat of high ecological value.



Parc Coed Bach, Pontarddulais, Abertawe - Lleoliad parcdir gyda chyfleusterau hamdden a choetir aeddfe. Yn 2012, comisiynodd Ffrindiau Parc Coedbach Arolwg Ecolegol wedi'i gyllido gan Amgylchedd Cymru a Thref Cyngor Pontarddulais. Yr amcanion oedd adnabod y cynefin a'r mathau o lystyfiant yn y parc ar gyfer rheolaeth ac ymwybyddiaeth leol. Adnabuwyd 47 rhywogaeth wahanol o goed gan gynnwys: derwen, onnen, bedwen, castanwydden, collen, masarnwydden a gwernen, yn creu cynefin coetir o werth ecolegol uchel.

31 different species of birds were identified in the survey including: treecreeper, chiffchaff, blackbird, blue tit, nuthatch, pied wagtail, chaffinch and linnet.



Adnabuwyd 31 gwahanol rywogaeth o adar yn yr arolwg, gan gynnwys: dringwr bach, siff-siaff, mwyalchen, tiwt tomos las, delor y cnau, siglen fraith, ji-binc a llinos.

Bluebells are a defining characteristic of our park. They are protected by law and the only protected species that were found during the survey.



Mae bwtsias y gog yn nodwedd ddifffyniadol o'r parc. Maent wedi'u diogelu gan y gyfraith a'r unig rywogaeth a amddiffynnir a ddarganfuwyd yn ystod yr arolwg.

There is an area of acid grassland where heather has been allowed to regenerate. This is an important ecological habitat and is ideal for our dwindling bee population and other insects. 79 different invertebrates were identified in this survey including: brown house moths, lesser wax moths, flame shooters and honey bees.



Mae yna ardal o laswelltir asid lle y caniateir i'r grug adfywio. Mae hwn yn gynefin ecolegol pwysig ac yn ddelfrydol i'r boblogaeth gwenyn sy'n lleihau ac i bryfed. Adnabuwyd 79 infertebratau gwahanol yn yr arolwg gan gynnwys: gwyfynod tŷ brown, gwyfynod cwyr bach, saethwyr fflamau a gwenyn.

Entrance is at the end of this road.


